Volunteers around Penrith get together for regular Bushcare days to help care for particular sites, including removing weeds and planting native plants. They also join in special planting projects throughout the year, such as *Trees for Mum* in May and National Tree Day in July.

- an opportunity for the whole family to work together
- an opportunity to meet your neighbours and people who share your interests
- a sense of ownership and achievement as you see the difference you've made to a particular site

Volunteers are given a site induction and full training before starting work. There is always experienced staff you can ask for advice or guidance.
